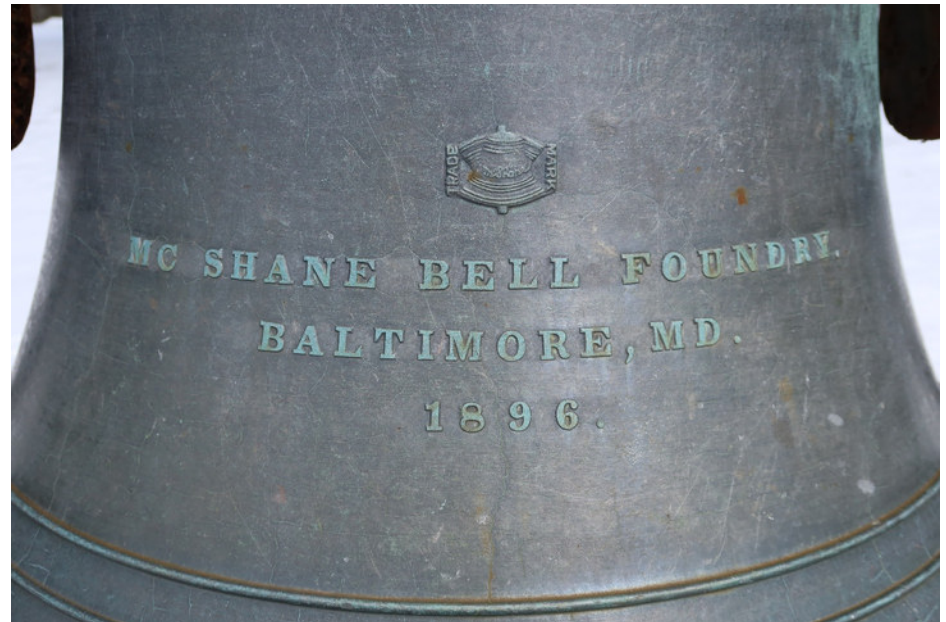
This book is a photographic overview of a borough in the Endless Mountains of Pennsylvania, affectionately known as “the town that time forgot.”

ON THIS SITE STOOD
THE HOTEL EAGLES MERE
BUILT IN 1879
KNOWN AS POINT BREEZE HOTEL FROM 1880-1887
WHEN IT WAS ENLARGED TO HOUSE 250 GUESTS
BY OWNER ERNEST V. INGHAM
ORIGINAL SECTION DEMOLISHED IN 1923, AND
REMAINING BUILDING MOVED OPPOSITE
PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH AND
RENAMED THE EDGEMERE.

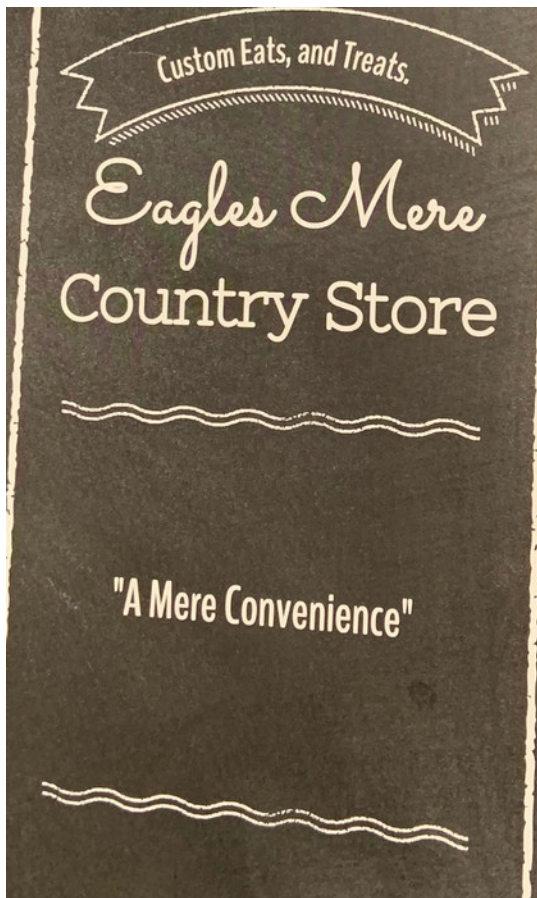
