

Eagles Mere's population of 151 increases to several thousand during the summer.











The Beach




Lake Rules

- 6. No swimming from boats

- 8. No rough play
- 9. No running on boardwalk or docks
- 10. No street clothes on the dock
- 11. No pets at the beach area, except those passing through on a leash
- 12. No fishing in the swimming area
- 13. Boaters must be registered with the Beach office and must follow all laws of the Pa Fish and Boat Commission
- 14. Report all accidents directly to the Beach Office



SITE OF THE ORIGINAL TOBOGGAN SLIDE BUILT IN 1904 DESIGNED AND ENGINEERED BY CAPT. E.S. CHASE.

BLOCKS OF ICE ARE MEASURED, CUT, AND TRANSPORTED TO THE FOOT OF LAKE AVE. WHERE CONSTRUCTION BEGINS. THE SLIDE, WHICH, IS 1200 FT. LONG, IS GROOVED TO FIT THE HAND - CRAFTED, WOODEN TOBOGGANS.

TODAY, E.M. SLIDE ASSOCIATION USES THE ORIGINAL PLANS-MODERN EQUIPMENT REPLACES THE OLD HORSE TEAMS, WAGONS, BOB-SLEDS AND HAND SAWS.


ON THIS SITE STOOD THE LAKESIDE HOTEL ONE OF THE FIRST HOTELS IN EAGLES MERE. THIS HOTEL WAS CONTINUOUSLY RUN FROM 1880 TO 1961 BY THE KIRK FAMILY WHO WERE ALSO INVOLVED IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF THE EAGLES MERE LAKE, THE WATER WORKS AND THE EAGLES MERE COUNTRY CLUB.

BUILT IN 1879 KNOWN AS POINT BREEZE HOTEL FROM 1880-1887 WHEN IT WAS ENLARGED TO HOUSE 250 GUESTS BY OWNER ERNEST V. INGHAM ORIGINAL SECTION DEMOLISHED IN 1923, AND REMAINING BUILDING MOVED OPPOSITE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH AND RENAMED THE EDGEMERE.
